The Next LEPs: Unlocking growth across our localities (Localis, March 2015)

Full survey results

The following survey was sent to key LEP stakeholders from both public and private sector backgrounds between October 2014 and January 2015. 158 people responded in total to at least one question in the survey. Responses were gained from every region in the country and every tier of local government. At least one (and in the majority of the 39 LEPs, more than one) representative of every LEP has responded to our consultation process all told. The raw data here has been interpreted in various ways, not least in the regional GVA breakdowns provided in the executive summary. Where appropriate double counting has been eliminated and percentages rounded up in the report.¹ The report, published in March 2015, was authored by Richard Carr with research, editorial and logistical support from Jack Airey and Alex Thomson.

¹ By way of elaboration, on p24 of the report it is asserted that 14 LEP board members were ascertained to be from BME communities. Using this we provide the estimate that 'fewer than 3%' of members are from these groups. This includes 49 cases where a lack of data made classification difficult, and thus we cannot use the full 607 board member total. Hence, in this instance, we have rounded up to 3% rather than down to 2%. This is inevitably a best estimate – but still indicates that BME representation on LEPs remains far lower than the 14% BME population in England and Wales: http://www.ons.gov.uk/ons/dcp171776_290558.pdf
